## 1. Core Art Fundamentals (The Basics)

- > Before diving into complex projects, students should understand the "alphabet" of art.
- > Drawing & Sketching: Line quality, shading (hatching, cross-hatching), and basic shapes.
- > Color Theory: Understanding the color wheel, Study of the Color Wheel, primary/secondary colors, and mixing "moods" (warm vs. cool tones). Monochromatic Color scheme
- > Perspective & Composition: The drawing 3D objects on flat surfaces and arranging elements for visual balance.

## 2. Painting & Mediums

- > Explore different textures and techniques using popular paints.
- > Pencil: exploring different grades of pencils , learning shading methods and techniques.
- > Oil pastels: how to blend oil pastels, understanding its texture and values.
- > Pen and Ink: different techniques of pen & ink using wash , hatching , crosshatching and many more.
- > Water and Poster colors: Wet-on-wet, dry brush, and "blooming" techniques for airy, light landscapes.
- > Acrylics Colors on Canvas: Layering, blending, and using palette knives for thick (impasto) textures.

## 3. Indian Traditional Paintings

- > Madhubani Paintings: Bharni (filled with vibrant colors) vs. Kachni (only fine line work)
- > Warli Art: The Geometry of Life: Use this to teach how complex human forms can be simplified into two triangles joined at the tip
- > Gond Painting Learn Gond art by creating vibrant patterns and stories inspired by nature and tribal traditions."
- > Kalamkaari Paintings: Discover the art of Kalamkari—hand-drawn patterns inspired by tradition and nature."
- > Mandala Art: "Learn Mandala art using basic geometric patterns, symmetry, line work, and dotting techniques to create balanced designs."

## 4. You will Learn

**Figurative Work:** "Learn figurative art by understanding human proportions, movement, basic anatomy, and expressive drawing techniques."

**Composition :** learn Placement of shapes, colors, and lines properly so the artwork looks balanced and pleasing to the eye.

**Abstract Art:** Explore abstract art by experimenting with colors, shapes, textures, and creative expression without boundaries."

**Impression Work:** Captures the overall feeling, mood, or impression of a subject rather than focusing on fine details..

**Portrait:** Learn portrait by mastering facial proportions, expressions, shading, skin tones, and realistic features."

**Clay Modeling:** Make shapes or figures using clay. Artists use their hands and tools to create objects like pots, animals, or human figures.

**Best Out of Waste:** Make useful or decorative things from old or thrown-away items.

**Pots Painting:** Learn pot painting to decorate terracotta pots using colors, patterns, and creative designs."

**Glass Painting:** Creating colorful designs on glass using special paints. Light will pass through the glass, making the artwork look bright and beautiful.
