Monthly Class

This section of your curriculum bridges the gap between hobbyist and professional, catering to a much wider demographic. These courses are often the "highest value" offerings for an art studio because they solve specific problems—like career entry or mental health.

1. Traditional Indian Art (Workshops)

These are ideal for short-term workshops (2–3 days) or weekend intensive modules.

- > **Madhubani (Mithila Art):** * Focus: Storytelling through nature.
- > **Technique:** Teaching the "double line" technique and the use of natural motifs (fish, peacocks, the Tree of Life).
- > **Application:** Students can move from paper to fabric (tote bags) or wooden trays.
- > **Lippan Art:** Applying a base of clay/gesso, carving patterns while wet, and embedding mirrors (Basics) (Application: Great for wall murals or interior decor.)
- > **Mandala Art:** * Focus: Precision and Geometry.
Technique: Using grid systems, compasses, and protractors to create "Radial Symmetry."
- > **Resin Art:** Learn resin art and create stunning coasters, trays, wall art, jewellery, and home décor pieces. "Learn basic resin art techniques like mixing, simple pouring, color blending, and smooth finishing."
- > **Oil painting:** A special interest oil painting course where students learn basic color mixing, brush techniques, shading, textures, and simple compositions."
- > **Acrylic Painting:** A special interest acrylic painting course where students learn basic color mixing, brush techniques, shading, textures, and simple compositions."
- > **Portrait:** A special interest portrait course for those who love drawing faces. Students will learn facial proportions, basic anatomy, shading techniques, skin tones, expressions, and how to create realistic portraits step by step."

2. Calligraphy & Hand Lettering

While Calligraphy is about the "set rules" of scripts, Hand Lettering is about "drawing" letters.

- > **Modern Brush Lettering:** Using brush pens to master "Thin Upstrokes & Thick Downstrokes." This is very popular for bullet journaling and greeting cards.
- > **Composition:** Learning how to "bounce" letters and flourish (adding decorative swirls) to create a quote-based masterpiece.

- > **Fluid Art (Acrylic Pouring):** The lack of control is therapeutic; it teaches "letting go."
